

There is no indication in the Bible that a person was baptized in water before receiving Christ as Savior. Through baptism we make a public statement of our identity with Jesus Christ. We say to the church and the world that now we belong to the family of God.

3. How do we baptize?

a) By immersion.

Mark 1:9-10 (ESV) - ⁹In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. ¹⁰And when he came up out of the water, immediately he saw the heavens being torn open and the Spirit descending on him like a dove.

- John the Baptist baptized Jesus in the Jordan River (v. 10). What phrase indicates that Jesus was baptized by immersion?

b) As soon as possible.

Acts 16:30-33 (ESV) - ³⁰Then he brought them out and said, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" ³¹And they said, "Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and your household." ³²And they spoke the word of the Lord to him and to all who were in his house. ³³And he took them the same hour of the night and washed their wounds; and he was baptized at once, he and all his family.

- When were the jailer and his family baptized?
 - On the following day
 - The same day they received Christ as Savior
 - Weeks later
- What did Paul and Silas explain to the jailer before he and his family were baptized? (v. 30-32)

c) By another believer.

Matthew 28:16-20 ¹⁶Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. ¹⁷And when they saw him they worshiped him, but some doubted. ¹⁸And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

- How many disciples were with Jesus at this moment?
- What four verbs describe the nature of this great commission?

Christians know that they are saved by grace, through faith and not by their works. They know that they will spend an eternity with God based on what Jesus did on the cross. God does not save us BY good works, but He saves us FOR good works (Ephesians 2:10). Those were prepared beforehand for us.

Water baptism is one of those good works. It is one of the first steps of obedience in our relationship with Him. Let's discover what the Bible teaches about water baptism.

1. What is baptism?

Matthew 28:19 ^(ESV) - *Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.*

It is a command.

a) Jesus commanded his disciples to make other disciples. According to Matthew 28:19, what were they to do with them?

b) What decision did the new followers of Christ have to make?

2. Who must be baptized?

Acts 2:41 ^(ESV) - *So those who received his word were baptized, and there were added that day about three thousand souls.*
